How to Advent...

As one of my favourite liturgical seasons, it's also the one that often gets overshadowed by all the other celebrations that it's meant to point towards. However, Advent is the sign of a new year, a time of renewal, and most of all a time to prepare. So how do we get the best out of Advent?

Dive into Daily Prayer

Spending time in prayer is the most important part of any spiritual journey. It's good to spend some time sitting with Scripture and allowing Our Lord to speak to your heart. Maybe take the time to journal your prayers and thoughts, and the ways Our Lord is speaking to you. If you're unsure where to start, use the readings from Sunday Mass, or perhaps pick up a guided daily reflection Advent devotional.

Ask yourself, "What's holding me back?"

Our Lord can only dwell in our hearts if we give Him permission to do so. We all have places in our hearts that we keep hidden from Our Lord, (at least we think it's hidden). Maybe it's a secret that we keep locked away from everyone, maybe it's a sin that we can't seem to shake, maybe it's a toxic relationship, or an attachment to material things, or ideas of ourselves... the list is endless. These things prevent Our Lord from fully entering into communion with us.

Make a Good Confession

Take the time to allow His mercy to heal you this Christmas. In the sacrament, we are given the opportunity to make room for Our Lord. Maybe we can only offer Him right now the stable. But that's okay, because we know He makes even the most pitiful places beautiful. He will take whatever you can give him.

Make an examination of conscience. Sit quietly with the Lord and think of all the ways we have distanced ourselves from Him through sin and recognize the ways we have failed in our journey to holiness. Empty yourself out in vulnerability in the Sacrament of Confession, share the things that hold you back from Him.

Christ did not come to us when we had it all together or when we were ready. He came in the midst of all our messes, in the midst of all our busyness. He entered into the mess of our lives...
