
First Sunday of Lent



<u>From The Desk of Fr. Dunstan</u>: We have faith, we pray, we trust in the Lord Jesus, and we say the Lord's prayer, at least once a week when we attend Mass. As we enter the first week of Lent, let us reflect on "lead us not into temptation". Jesus was led by the angel to the desert to fast and pray for forty days to be with God intimately. At the very moment, Jesus entered the desert, the devil squeeze in to take him away from God with his temptations. Satan tried all means to win Jesus, first by transforming the stone into bread, second with the test of God's providence and protection, and then with the attraction of the power of the world against the Kingdom of heaven. Being aware of the tricks of Lucifer, Jesus did not fall into temptation.

On the contrary, in the full freedom and liberty, despite having everything, pushed by the cunningness of the serpent, both Adam and Eve, being naive and with greed, fell into temptation and sinned against God. These results, first losing the presence of God and the shame with their own nakedness, second loosing image and likeness of God who created them with freedom and liberty and finally hiding themselves behind nature and the fellow human with insincerity. Is this not something that we do always?

We are blessed by God with the gift of life. Most of us have everything we need to live. But sometimes instead of being satisfied with what we have, we compare with others who live around us and be tempted with greed and consequently we fall into several unnecessary problems. Finally, we blame others, situations, and even God Himself for our own failures.

Every year the Church invites us, during the season of Lent to be aware of our fragilities and to seek the mercy of God with the realization and true repentance by saying, "be compassionate O Lord, for we have sinned", and we know where sin increased, there grace increased all the more.

Dear brothers and sisters, as we pray, "Our Father in Heaven ... lead us not into temptation" every time, let us acknowledge all the trials we face and plead to God to give us abundance of grace and the gift of justification in the kingdom of heaven, through Jesus Christ who grant us Eternal Life in spite of our transgressions. Amen.
