

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King Of The Universe



Today, the Catholic Church celebrates the last Sunday of the liturgical year. The culminating point of the entire year is the celebration of Christ the King of the Universe who reigns in heaven and on earth. The solemnity of Christ the King points us toward the ultimate goal of human life, that is, union with God and devotion to the reign of his love in his Kingdom. Next Sunday marks the beginning of Advent and a new liturgical year.

Note From The Pastor's Desk: Dear

parishioners, I have reached a point in my ministry when a six-month sabbatical is often taken. After 26 years of priesthood, I had planned the sabbatical for 2024 or 2026. This is always dependent on the availability of a suitable priest to take the pastor's place from January to June. As divine providence would have it, a very suitable priest has become available in the Archdiocese for 2023, much sooner than anticipated. Fr. James Dunstan, of the religious congregation known as the "Voluntas Dei Institute", has been the superior of his international congregation, bringing a proven competency for leadership and pastoral work around the world, and he will be in residence here at St. John's for the next seven months. Fr. James has graciously agreed to be the Administrator of the Parish from January to June. His community, "Voluntas Dei", is a secular institute of pontifical right, meaning it is recognized by the Church at the highest level as a community of consecrated persons, male and female, lay and clergy, with a spirituality of leavening the world like the yeast Jesus speaks of in his parables. A priest's sabbatical is to be a time of renewal, primarily spiritual, but also intellectual, so I will be culminating my theological updating with the classic 30-day silent, directed Ignatian retreat, which I have never had the opportunity to do, and which I believe will provide a spiritual basis for more effective priestly ministry. I am here until the end of December, and I will be doing my studies and retreats locally, so you might see me from time to time, and I will be returning July 1st. I invite you to accompany me in prayer, perhaps seeking spiritual renewal in your own way. I am sure that you will give Fr. James Dunstan a warm St. John's welcome and your prayerful support as he shares his deep spirituality with you from January to June next year, and simply get to know the Lord Jesus better through this opportunity, by discerning God's will for us, and learning to embrace God's will with every decision we make. Let us pray for one another.

THE PALLIATIVE CARE HOPELINE: Palliative care services are helpful not only when a person is approaching death but also during the earlier stages of an illness. Accessing resources to support a palliative and end-of-life journey can seem overwhelming for newly diagnosed patients, caregivers, and family members. The HopeLine, established as part of the Catholic Charities/Archdiocese of Toronto Palliative Care Project and operated by the Saint Elizabeth Foundation, will act as an information resource tool to help callers establish connections with hospice palliative care options within their home community. Supported in part by ShareLife funding, the HopeLine is open to individuals in the Archdiocese of Toronto's catchment area who are interested in discovering palliative/end-of-life support services and holistic care for themselves, their caregivers and extended family and friends. This resource seeks to connect people with services that align with Catholic faith teaching.
