Twenty-Eighth Sunday In Ordinary Time



In the Gospel Readings today, all 10 of the lepers were given the gift of healing, but in his gratitude to God for this gift, the Samaritan found salvation. Our salvation is found in recognizing the gifts we have been given and knowing to whom we must offer our thanks.

Liturgy Notes: The Nicene Creed: Part 3 - AND **ROSE AGAIN ON THE THIRD DAY!!** When we recite these words in our Profession of Faith, we should feel the joy of the first Christians when they learned that Jesus was not dead, but was alive! Alleluia! As you proclaim this marvellous truth, at the same time, you hear your brothers and sisters around you proclaiming it to all present. Our hearts should soar upward. Our bodies should want to as well. Physically jumping in the air would best express what we should feel when we proclaim the Resurrection of Jesus Christ in the Creed. Although jumping in the pews is not recommended, we are encouraged to do the opposite gesture of bowing when we say, "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." The profound bow made during these words is a timeless and universal religious gesture of dying before the Holy One, for we are not worthy even to stand in the presence of the mighty Creator of all things. But the Divine Son humbled himself to be born of a virgin, and in awesome recollection of the mystery of Christ's incarnation, we say these words while humbly bowed before God. On two special days – Christmas and the Annunciation (March 25), we replace the bow with a genuflection, recognizing that the Son of God so humbled himself for our sake that he came to earth as one of us. We pray with our bodies when we pray the Nicene Creed, a good expression that the Christian faith is an incarnate faith, not merely spiritual, redeeming the entire human person, body and soul. Fr. 
