## The Most Holy Trinity



From the Desk of Fr. Dunstan: Our Faith sometimes seems so intimidating vet so fulfilling. One that seems more intimidating to explain is the Most Holy Trinity. How best to explain The Holy Trinity? I will try with the example of the roles in our lives. What do I mean by that? Well, let us take the example of Men and Women. As a wife or a husband, one of our roles is to develop and nurture our love for one another. As we mature and begin to have children, our role as a Mother or a Father, is to develop and nurture our children. As our children become adults, begin their own life, and have their own children our role now becomes the many roles of Grandparents. Yet we are the same person. The same applies to Triune God: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. God the Father, like any father in traditional families, has the role of the authority figure who gives us the guidelines in the form of commandments to abide in his love. In order to manifest his love, he became Jesus God the Son who shows us the love of the Father through miracles, parables and simple teachings. He came and lived among us; showed us the right way through his life. He chose the disciples to teach us the life, the truth and the way. Finally, he died for us so we too may have the eternal life. However, before he left to heaven, he gave to us God the Holy Spirit, to be with us, to inspire us, to guide us with the heavenly virtues and values of the kingdom of God the Father. It is like a Grandparent who guides the grandkids with the wisdom, experience and maturity by giving the moral values. As one-person plays different roles on earth, God plays as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in heaven for our salvation.

DID YOU KNOW: St. John's Church, dedicated on June 5, 1932, celebrates 91 years on Monday. The church you see today is the second building on the site. It replaced a small brick church dedicated to St. John the Evangelist built in 1892 that stood east and west and accommodated about one hundred and fifty worshippers. The renovation of the church interior was completed in 1988 to comply with the directives of Vatican II. At that time, the altar rail was removed, the main altar made smaller and moved several feet back, and a new altar created, partly from the marble of the old altar. The altar railings were utilized both around the main altar and in front of the side altars dedicated to the Sacred Heart and Our Lady. A carved wooden pulpit was removed, and replaced with a marble lectern decorated with a mosaic of the eagle, the symbol of St. John the Evangelist.
