

Thirty-Second Sunday In Ordinary Time



"Lord, Lord, open the door for us!" But he said in reply, "Amen I say to you, I do not know you." Mt 25:11-12

From the Pastor's Desk: THE ENTRANCE

PROCESSION: After a time of quiet preparation, the Mass formally begins with an entrance procession, accompanied by the singing of a hymn in praise of God. We all stand in joyful attentiveness to the signs of Christ entering into our midst. Most of us might remain in our pews, rather than being in the procession, but the procession of the Priest and ministers sums up the entrance of all of us into this holy assembly, completing the Mystical Body of Christ gathered in the church. In going from the door to the altar, the entrance procession expresses in ritual form our pilgrimage through life towards heaven, led by Christ, seen in the Cross at the head of the procession. Christ's triumph over death makes our progress to the altar of heaven possible, so the procession is lead by the Cross whenever possible. We follow him in our daily lives, and today, on the Lord's Day, Christ leads us to the altar, where he will be our sacred Host. The Cross is honoured with lit candles in the procession, and on special days, even sweet-smelling incense rises before it, like the pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night (as in the Exodus). The Book of Gospels, another means by which Christ will be present to us, and in which his voice will be heard, is carried with reverence by the Deacon. The ministers in the procession are clothed in white robes, the vesture of the saints in heaven who follow the Lamb (a scene from the Book of Revelation), over which the priest and Deacon wear coloured garments suitable to a solemn celebration of the Church. Throughout the entrance procession, our singing together of the opening hymn unites us in voice and in heart, disposing us for the unity which the Holy Spirit will bring about as we let all these signs of worship of the one Savior of humankind leave their impression on our hearts.
