
#### Seventh Sunday In Ordinary Time



"Whoever keeps the word of Christ, the love of God is truly perfected in him."

<u>From The Desk of Fr. Dunstan:</u> We are in the last week of Ordinary Time, as we enter into the Lenten season, next week with Ash Wednesday.

As we begin this Holy season of Lent, the Lord is inviting us to concentrate on love (once again). How are we shown this love? Our prime example starts with Jesus, who came to the Earth to show us God's love through his sacrifice on the cross. Saint Paul, in today's reading, invites us to show love to ourselves by respecting our bodies, as our bodies are the Temple of the Holy Spirit. We are even called to love through holiness. How? Since we are created in the image and likeness of the Heavenly Father, who is holy, we too are called to be holy like him, through our actions — just like Jesus.

Now for my homework to you for this season, make a sacrifice. Each year, during Lent, we have this 'tradition' of giving something up. This is to mirror Jesus' 40 day and night preparation in the desert leading up to Palm Sunday. However, I would like us to show our love by making this sacrifice charitable.

Now this sacrifice is something small, and achievable from your day to day life, such as not buying coffee for the day, or not buying desert after dinner out, or forgoing that afternoon snacking chocolate. When you make this sacrifice, you will then match that sacrifice with an amount of money. You get to decide how much, of course. At the end of Lent, on Easter Vigil, you will then be making a donation to St. Vincent de Paul, by sharing your sacrifice to help out someone in need through the St. Vincent de Paul charity. This act of sacrificial love will then become our part to make ourselves holy (since we're showing love) to receive the Grace of God.

So, as we end this Ordinary Time, and step into the season of Lent, let us say to the Lord, "Lord, I am ready to pray. I am ready to make a sacrifice. I am ready to share. May God Bless us. Amen."

CANADIAN BISHOPS RELEASE PASTORAL LETTERS
TO ADVANCE THE HEALING JOURNEY WITH
INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF THIS LAND. On February 8,
2023, the Bishops of Canada released a series of pastoral letters
to advance the journey of healing, reconciliation and hope with
Indigenous Peoples of this land. Individual letters have been
prepared for First Nations, Inuit and Métis communities. In
addition, the bishops have released a letter to Catholics
throughout the country. Catholics throughout the archdiocese
are invited to reflect, learn and join in efforts to nurture and
deepen our relationship with Indigenous Peoples. We pray that
the letters may serve as an additional tool to guide the journey

#### TURKEY AND SYRIA EARTHQUAKE -

**HUMANITARIAN RELIEF: Two devastating** earthquakes and hundreds of violent aftershocks in Turkey and Syria have caused great destruction in both countries. As search and rescue operations continue, the latest reports indicate that there are more than 40,000 people injured and the rising death toll has now surpassed 11,000 people. The disaster began with a 7.8-magnitude earthquake early Monday morning, one of the strongest to hit the region in 100 years, toppled thousands of buildings throughout Turkey and Syria, creating even worse conditions for millions of Syrians already displaced by the ongoing civil war. Freezing cold weather conditions are complicating rescue operations and adding further risk to survivors. The Archdiocese of Toronto will accept donations and channel funds through Catholic partners (including Caritas Canada, Aid to the Church in Need, CNEWA, and Jesuits International) to support relief efforts underway.
