

<u>From The Desk of Fr. Dunstan</u>: Today we begin the Holy Week with Palm Sunday (when Jesus made his final entrance into Jerusalem) and culminates with Easter Sunday. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday (Easter Vigil) are the important days during this Holy Week, which is known as Easter or Paschal Triduum. It begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, enters Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, and reaches its high point and closes in the Easter Vigil. Even though, it covers three days, it is one and only liturgy which covers the whole Paschal Mystery, (Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection).

On Holy Thursday, the Church celebrates the Institution of the Holy Eucharist recalling the Last Supper of Our Lord Jesus Christ where Jesus asked His disciples "to do this in memory of Me". We also recall and affirm the institution of Priesthood in the washing of the feet which invites all priests to take part in the priesthood of Jesus who washed the feet of his disciples manifesting the service of humility. Holy Thursday service ends with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," where people of God are called to stay and pray with the reposed Eucharist, remembering Jesus' request in the Garden of Gethsemene to "watch and pray" with him.

Good Friday is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world. This day is the only day the Church does not celebrate Mass. This is to signify Jesus' death. People of God come to Church to meditate the suffering and death of Jesus. Priests prostrate themselves, at the beginning of the service before listening as the Passion narratives are read while contemplating Jesus' death. Adoration of the cross takes place at this service, in which the priest and the people of God kneel before the cross and venerate it. We are also invited to observe the day of fasting and abstinence.

Holy Saturday, after nightfall, before dawn on Easter Sunday, the Vigil celebration takes place to rejoice the Resurrection of Jesus. At the Easter Vigil, the Service of Light, the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of Baptism, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist are included to remind the people how Jesus brought Light of Life to all and all the faithful through baptism have received the grace of salvation and eternal life. You may also see at this Mass RCIA catechumens being brought into full Communion with the Catholic Church. RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults a process through which non-baptized men and women enter the Catholic Church. It includes several stages marked by study, prayer and rites at Mass.)

Let us enter in to this Holy Week keeping in mind the suffering of our Lord Jesus Christ for our salvation.
