
Fifth Sunday In Ordinary Time



Jesus said to his disciples: "You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house. Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."

Note From The Desk of Fr. Dunstan: February 2nd, we celebrated the Feast of The Presentation of Jesus which is also the day dedicated to the persons of the consecrated life who are called to practice the evangelical counsels with humility to live obedience, the simplicity to live poverty and the fidelity to live chastity in daily life in all circumstances. This committed life is also applicable to all baptized Christian.

Let us ask, ourselves, am I living my quality of humility to cherish the will of God? Am I sharing what I have with everyone in my life to accomplish the love of God? Where am I standing as a human, as a Christian, towards fidelity to God and his will? No one can tell us how to respond, it is a personal response.

Jesus said: "for even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve." (Mk 10/45) He affirms further by saying that he has come not to do his own will, but the will of the Father who sent him. (Jn. 6/38)

Similarly, we all are called by baptism and will have to render an account to God. We gather at our parish to build peace within ourselves to promote mutual confidence love understanding and belongingness not only within our parish community but also in the secular environment where we live. We are called to participate with our own identity in the life of the local and universal Church.

Where am I in my standing as a parishioner of St. John? What is my response? What is my involvement towards my own parish? How do I manifest myself to in humility, simplicity and fidelity to others as a witnessing catholic?

Am I a visible witness amid the world as a baptized person?
