Chesterton got it right when he said that the family is a good institution precisely because it is uncongenial; it is wholesome because it exposes us to the variety of mankind and, from the moment of our birth, takes us on a true adventure.

No one has hurt me more than my youngest sister; no one has disappointed me more than my older brother; no one has frustrated and embarrassed me more than my youngest sibling. When I watched the movie *The Banshees of Inisherin*, I was in agony, huddled up in a ball, because that movie reminded me of the years I was rejected by my youngest sister. The lead actor captured the hurt and confusion so well. Had my youngest sister been a friend, I would have let her go long ago, but because she is my sister, she remains in my life.

Families can help you grow in love, faith and forgiveness because they touch you deeply even when they are flawed – or perhaps – precisely because they are flawed. You know them and you love them. And, boy, can it be hard to forgive them! However, if you model yourself on Christ, and ask for help, and never give up, all things are possible.




Congratulations!

Marked annually in Canada on April 28th, the National Day of Mourning is "Dedicated to remembering those who have lost their lives, or suffered injury or illness due to workplace related hazards and occupational exposures."

It is also a day to collectively renew commitments to improve health and safety in the workplace to prevent further injuries, illnesses and deaths.

Traditionally, on April 28th, the Canadian flag has flown at half-mast on Parliament Hill and on all federal government buildings.

All are encouraged to pause at 11:00 a.m. on April 28th for a moment of silence to honour the working lives lost, injured or made ill.
