CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE Fr. Paul Magyar



Greetings everybody, peace be to you, your families and homes. As we begin a new season I would like to turn our attention to our blessed mother. In the gospel of Luke, Mary of Nazareth is approached by the angel Gabriel and told that she has been chosen by God to be the mother of the son of God, Jesus Christ, the saviour of humanity. Usually

great heroes of antiquity are born to noble families. However the hero of heroes, the combination of all the good attributes of all heroes, Jesus Christ is born to as Mary describes herself as a lowly handmaid.

Mary is chosen to be the mother of God because of her courage. She sets off alone through difficult mountain terrain for days to visit her cousin Elizabeth. Mary can spot evil and malevolence before it occurs and she is not intimidated by it. Her faith is beyond all fear. This is why Mary is depicted as standing barefoot on top of a venomous snake. None of us would dare to step barefoot on any snake, let alone a venomous one.

In the book of revelation Mary is described as standing on the moon, wearing the sun as her clothing and the stars as her crown. She becomes the sum of all light in the universe because she is about to give birth to the light of the world, Jesus Christ. Her motherhood and therefore all motherhood has been elevated to divine status.

There is also this Godzilla-sized 7 headed red dragon standing right in front of Mary, ready to devour her child Jesus as soon as he is born. However, Mary is not intimidated by this dragon at all because as she describes in the magnificat, she is protected by the arm of God. Councils and / or multi-Assemblies conduct the ceremony together, this makes for a lot of extra work on those who have to preside over these ceremonies, having to install one Council or one Assemble at a time.

My kindest request to the Clergy, please see if you can find a way to hold these ceremonies to include multiple Councils or Assemblies to try to clear the enormous backlog.

Safe Environment Requirements – IMPORTANT NOTICE If you have not read the email sent to you recently, Brothers you need to take special notice of this communication as it will affect you and your participation in many Council activities.

You need to understand where this is headed and how it affects every Knight in every Council. Every Brother Knight who wishes to participate in any program where there is the possibility of interaction with children (a person below the age of 18 years) such as Basketball Free Throw, Coats for Kids, Soccer Challenge, Hockey Challenge, Essay contest and Substance abuse poster contest or in any other in-school program Must have completed a back ground Police Check. The exception to this strict rule is, those who volunteer in your Parish Church and are involved in a Church activity that requires a Police Check and in such cases the Parish will conduct the Screening and Police Check for you and the Archdiocese will also pay for it. Other wise, the Council is responsible to pick up the cost which is \$31 per person for volunteers (in York Region it may be less for your area) and is good for 3 years.

Also, every volunteer in any of the above activities "Basketball Free Throw, Coats for Kids, Soccer Challenge, Hockey Challenge, Essay contest and Substance abuse poster contest or in any other inschool program or dealing with vulnerable persons" Must be trained in the organization's abuse policies and procedures by reviewing the Abuse Protocol and this review needs to be refreshed annually. The Abuse Protocol are those stipulated by Supreme under the Praesidium label and consist of three parts - Know your Policies / Meet Sam / Duty to Report.

NOTE: Tracking of Members who have completed the Abuse Protocol review training is important documentation that may be used in your defense of an allegation.

In order for your Council to administer this effectively, it is recommended your Council have one person to be in overall charge of this function which will involve the establishing and maintenance of an ongoing Record of the Knights by name who has taken the Training and received their Police Check together with the expiry date of such approval, also the annual review of the Abuse Protocol and signoff by the incumbent. If you wish to be considered for this very important task, please contact your Grand Knight as soon as you can. These records are to be saved indefinitely and permanently. It is recommended that the record be saved for a min of 33 years.

Training during September: A complete Training Package from Supreme for the months of September, is included in this bulletin. Thanks to SK Wayne Fink, Regional Training Director.

E Transfer Payment to TEAZ Now available: Councils and Assemblies may now pay their TEAZ Dues (Council Dues = \$50.00 / Assembly Dues = \$20.00.) using e Transfer. For

COMMUNITY MATTERS: Helping the Homeless

The current pandemic has impacted several social services. The Good Shepherd Ministries is one of many recipients of charitable donations from several individuals and organizations, including KofC councils. How is it coping with the homeless during these COVID times? And how can we help Good Shepherd and other social service organizations?

"We would be happy to accept donations. We have also attached our current wish lists below if this provides you with any other ideas.

"As for us coping with COVID, we have altered our program slightly. We have had to socially distance our overnight guests so only 50 men stay at the shelter (including 25 DARE clients) and the remaining 47 are at a hotel contracted by the City and managed by Good Shepherd at a location close by. Our meal program has gone from the traditional setting to a Meals-to-Go, where we hand out hot meals and bagged lunches from 2-4 pm. We have had to close the drop in and some counseling sessions are limited and some have gone "virtual". Any new admissions undergo rapid

testing and we have had numerous vaccine clinics on site - in fact there is one this afternoon. We are now approximately 80% fully vaccinated which is good news."

MEAL PROGRAM NEEDS: packaged snacks, e.g. granola bars, chocolate bars, potato chips cookies, fruit cups, fruits (apples, bananas, oranges), juice boxes, water. DORMITORY NEEDS: toothpastes, toothbrushes, deodorant, shampoo, individual bar soap/shower gel). MEN'CLOTHING ONLY (all sizes): sweaters and hoodies, sweatpants/joggers, jeans, winter coats, sneakers.

- THE VATICAN

VATICAN CITY – August 18, 221 The Associated Press — Pope Francis is adding his voice to a campaign to overcome vaccine skepticism, issuing a public service announcement insisting that vaccines are safe, effective and an "act of love."

In his comments, Francis said: "Being vaccinated with vaccines authorized by the competent authorities is an act of love. And contributing to ensure the majority of people are vaccinated is an act of love. Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most vulnerable."

Francis had emphasized at the start of the pandemic the need to ensure equal access to the vaccine, especially for the poor. But faced with increasing skepticism about vaccines especially among religious conservatives, the Vatican has vowed an all-out effort to overcome hesitancy and encourage widespread vaccination.

The Vatican has declared that it is morally acceptable for Catholics to receive COVID-19 vaccines, including those based on research that used cells derived from aborted fetuses.
